

address our economic  
situation here in Grant  
County. We have 1 mill &  
its closing on Nov. 24.  
We need timber + logging.  
Prairie Wood is supposed  
to open - hopefully  
Logging + ranching are  
our mainstay here.

I hope the F.S. personnel  
will work with our mills  
to make a durable plan  
to keep people employed  
in our mills.

I am against any  
more wilderness. - we  
have plenty. Seems to  
me the wilderness today  
planning is next to  
already existing wilder-  
ness areas. Perhaps you  
need to expand those  
older wilderness areas  
to be able to lock up  
more of our forests.

Many residents  
here in John Day - or all  
of Grant City - are older

and would like to hunt areas they hunted when younger - but being those areas are now wilderness + your expanding those areas) They can't reach the old hunting grounds.

I am worried that you couldn't find any references to put priorities for Ranchers' cattle on the forest.

You seem to have left out the most important items - why is that?
