Members of the Society have already shown their interest in this project through meetings with local Forest Service personnel and subsequent interviews where they expressed views of the past, the present, and the future of the Blanchard Springs Caverns Project and its contributions to the people of the area.

Many of those interviewed had ancestors who settled the land, built their homes, their community, and raised their children before being buried there. They built dams and mills before the structures that still partially stand to ground the corn they raised there into meal and to bale their cotton while using the very waters that flow from the Spring that continues to be visited by locals and tourists every year.

The Stone County Historical Society has documented much of the history of the area that became Blanchard Springs within its publications which were provided to the Forest Service. There remain records at the Stone County Museum available to any who wants to research.
