Dear Mystic District Ranger,

I would like to comment on the Rochford Mineral Exploratory Drilling Project by first stating what I feel is central to many of my statements.

"The Black Hills National Forest's mission, like all National Forests, is *to sustain the health*, diversity, and productivity of its forests and grasslands to meet the needs of present and future generations. This encompasses *protecting natural resources*, providing recreational opportunities, and supporting the local community. The Forest Plan, which guides all resource management, sets goals, objectives, and guidelines for resource management."

The Black Hills are scared land to the Lakota people which requires our respect and honor. Contamination of any part of the Hills by drilling would be disrespectful to their beliefs and rich heritage. By doing this drilling, the possibility of endangering precious creek water and underground water sources is too great. The air quality, plants and animals would, also, be placed in great jeopardy.

The proposal calls for 18 pads with 10 drill holes in each which results in 180 drill holes. And that would be just the beginning. This is absolutely unacceptable. The Black Hills cannot support such a violation to its fragile ecology. At first glance, the Black Hills may look rugged but in reality, this land is a delicate group of interconnected systems. The result to the land itself should not be neglected. And how would the wildlife and their habitat be disturbed with the drilling now and in their future? From my understanding, a complete Environmental Impact Statement has not even been done. It is my hope you will decide to deny the Rochford Mineral Exploratory Drilling Proposal NOW. Your decision will have lasting consequences for generations.
