This is the formal 30-day public comment period for this project and is a designated opportunity for public participation pursuant to 36 CFR 218.25. **Based on these regulations, comments concerning this project must be postmarked or received within 30 calendar days following the publication of the legal notice in the New Hampshire Union Leader.** A copy of the legal notice is also available on the project website. If the time period expires on a Saturday, Sunday, or a federal holiday, the time is extended to the end of the next federal working day. Only individuals or entities who submit timely and specific written comments (as defined by 36 CFR 218.2) about this

proposed project during this or another public comment period established by the responsible official will be eligible to file an objection. Other eligibility requirements are identified at 36 CFR 218.25(a)(3) and include name, postal address, title of the project, identity of the individual or entity who authored the comments, and signature of other verification of identity upon request. Comments received in response to this request will be available for public inspection and will be released in their entirety if requested pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act.

The project webpage provides several tools for you to engage in this process if you wish. Electronic comments submitted through the Forest Service online comment system are preferred. The District Ranger will present the project proposal and how to comment, followed by a question-and-answer open house with resource specialists. The Androscoggin Ranger District Office is located at 300 Glen Road, Gorham, NH 03581.
