The proposal of this mine to the area would absolutely destroy it. It is a quiet, pristine lake and the Forest Service is responsible for that. I want to thank you that rules and regulations have kept it that way. The thought of 130 trucks going up and down that road per day is sickening. It will ruin the pavement, to say nothing of the numbers of people that will be coming into the area, which is very limited in the number of people it can accommodate. There is only one small resort and a few campgrounds. This is not an area that can handle hordes of people. Another concern is the noise (not to mention accidents from cars trying to pass big, slow-moving trucks) from these trucks with their jake brakes coming down the grade. This will be disturbing to all who are trying to vacation and enjoy the serene beauty of Warm Lake. Noise travels across the lake and one can hear people talking clear across the water on the other side.
