We are an investment advisory firm based in Idaho, and have been researching and investing in mining companies around the world since our inception nearly 25 years ago. We have known Stephen Quin, the President and CEO of Midas Gold, for over twenty years, and can attest to his industry reputation as one of the most sincere and responsible executives in the industry. Last month we had the opportunity to take a tour of the Stibnite property and hear about the future plans for the project, in particular their plans for restoring the area and further environmental considerations around the project.
