Again no change should be made to Mill Creek access and Herring Creek loop: inside the loop, North of loop, east of loop. Eagle Meadow/Long Valley everything south of main road. North and east of long Valley. Proposing 12" Minimum depth including roadways. Top of Sonora Pass to remain open to snowmobilers.

Forest service can not restrict access of property owners to private property. Your proposed maps do this. Access to our property should be allowed from all areas.
