I strongly agree with preserving the environment and natural vegetation in the Chugach National Forest, so I agree with the decision to wait for adequate snow overage for the forest service to open the motorized access to our riding zones. This leads to my next point, snowmachining is a very low environmental impact sport.

I support Plan B to keep our motorized access. I would love to see some more areas opened up to motorized use and but this needs to be done in an efficient and low impact way.
