A quick overview shows a good balance for the different user groups. We both have spectacular places to go play!

Specifically it is important to maintain the southern boundary that delineates the Tenderfoot creek Drainage. This is a very important boundary as identified in the Kenai Winter Access plan Summit Forest Order D. This boundary enables the non motorized community to continue the traditional access up Ski Hill Ridge (directly behind Summit Lake Lodge) without worrying if there is going to be a conflict with the motorized when descending from Ski Hill Ridge into the Tenderfoot creek drainage. This base of Ski hill Ridge had a rope tow 60 years ago. I have skied this ridge since the early 80's. The tour to the top of this ridge and the ski run out Tenderfoot creek is a world class ski tour. Tenderfoot drainage is easily accessed by the non motorized community and is exactly the kind of terrain we need access to fully experience our human powered adventures. The Current Kenai Winter Access plan is working well because of the thoughtful consideration of the different user groups. What ever Alternative is selected I respectfully request that Summit Forest Order Exhibit D be included as is. Thanks
