Please see attached a testimony for a proposed cougar bill in Oregon. Your cougar management plan needs to be improved to allow cougars to established fully functioning ecological populations. They mitigate Lyme disease by reducing the tick's ecology and human exposure. Cougar also sanitizes the ecosystems by removing deer infected with chronic wasting disease BEFORE the symptoms are visible to the human eye. You are merely managing for hunting and invasive species livestock profits, and not for the ecosystems for which the cougar improve for everyone. You cannot stop auto accidents any more than you can prevent a rare cougar attack, but we can educate the public and create management plans that reduce accidents. Killing more cougar increases more cougar, livestock, and human conflicts. Killing less cougar reduces such conflicts, including Lyme disease exposure and CWD.
