Attached to this email is the Pacific Crest Trail Association's objection in response to the Stanislaus National Forest Over-snow Vehicle Use Designation Project Draft Record of Decision (ROD). This objection also includes the attached document with maps supporting our remedy proposal.

We are objecting to the Stanislaus National Forest OSV Use Designation Project Draft ROD, which proposes to allow OSV use immediately adjacent to the PCT for .48 miles, because we do not believe the Draft Decision complies with the National Trails System Act or the Forest Service Pacific Crest National Scenic Trail Comprehensive Management Plan. It is our intention, as the Forest Service's primary private partner in the management and maintenance of the Pacific Crest National Scenic Trail, to work with the agency in a cooperative and collaborative manner to ensure this project's final Decision supports management of the PCT that provides for the nature and purposes of the Trail.
