WHEREAS, The USFS and BLM manage about 97.7 million acres for multiple use purposes; including; timber production, fish and wildlife, water, mining and recreation; based on priorities and compatibility.

WHEREAS, with the current 2001 Road less Rule, timber provided just under 1% of Southeast Alaska's jobs according to the Southeast Conference Organization.

WHEREAS, the current 2001 Roadless Rule has and continues to harm the Southeast Alaska communities ability to develop sustainable, year-round economy, where less then 1% of the land is privately owned.

WHEREAS, the USFS and the Southeast Alaska communities should be able to manage and protect the sustainable natural resource known as The Tongass National Forest; and provide sustainable year-round jobs for the communities o Southeast Alaska that lie within the boundaries of said National Forest.
