Dear Sirs and Madams,

Via a letter from my homeowners[rsquo] association we heard about the planned oil & amp; gas exploration of the Oil & amp; Gas EIS project for potential fracking in the area of Lake Conroe and Sam Houston National Forest.

We are living in the Corinthian Point community since more than two years and the major point for us buying a property there was the close location to Lake Conroe as well as to the Sam Houston National Forest. For us this is one of the last natural places in the wider Houston area that still assures some quality relaxation. This quality is highly dependent on an untouched nature.

Any plans to allow fracking in this area will inevitable destroy the living quality in this area. The population growth of the greater Houston area is predicted to rise by more than one million people each decade.
