Comments: As a sixth generation Idahoan and the representative of its 35th Legislative district, I am always looking for opportunities that will benefit Idaho. After review of the U.S. Forest Service draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for Midas Gold Idaho's Stibnite Gold Project I would like to voice my support for the proper permitting of this unique opportunity. This project will grow Idaho's economy and help restore the environment and habitat around the historic Stibnite mining district that has seen years of neglect.

The Stibnite Gold Project will make substantial contributions to Idaho's economy. Midas has committed to hiring and purchasing locally whenever viable. During the expected 20-year life span of the project, Midas has projected that Stibnite gold will hire more than 1,000 employees and invest a total of \$1 billion into the state. During the operations stage of the project Midas plans to hire more than 500 employees within state, and nearly 200 of those workers will come from Valley and Adams Counties.

Midas Gold also plans to restore the local habitat and fix the environmental problems left by previous years of unregulated mining.
