* [bull] Removing legacy tailings and waste will lower concentrations of antimony and arsenic in the East Fork of the South Fork of the Salmon River . (One monitoring well found arsenic levels 700 times higher than the drinking water standard.) (Ch 4 Sec 4.9)

[bull] Removing legacy tailings and waste will also improve water quality in Meadow Creek. (Ch 3, 4.12 103-104) [bull] The mitigation plan will provide a 40% increase in wetland acres, which help to filter and clean groundwater.(Ch 4, 4.11.2.2.1.1 and 4.11.2.3.1.2)

There are so many other positive impacts that would come from allowing Midas Gold to clean up the old Stibnite mining district. It would stabilize soil erosion, protect the area from anticipated future effects of climate change, remove sedimentation from the river, and finally restore the full fish migration route that has been blocked since the late 1930s. All of that is documented in the USFS draft too.
