Comments: I am writing today because I understand the U.S. Forest Service is considering Midas Gold's proposed project for Idaho and I wanted to express my support. After reviewing their plan, I believe that this project will benefit our state, our local economies and more importantly our environment. I would like to explain why I believe you should approve Midas's Stibnite Gold Project without further delay.

The U.S. Forest Service is a respected institution with a noble cause. Previous mining projects have destroyed our local ecosystems and environment. Many of these projects occurred before current environmental regulations were established.
