Comments: Cleaning up the old mining sites around Valley County has been a concern of mine for many years now. But it's not just me. Many of my friends and family in this area are tired of the environmental damage these old mines created. And frankly, these mining sites are an eyesore for people who enjoy the outdoors. That's why I'm writing you in support of Midas Gold's Alternative 2 plan.

Under Midas's Alternative 2 plan, the company has agreed to clean up two of the existing mining sites that date back to the 1800s.
