Somewhat as the Euro-American Buffalo Hide Hunters were in that for profit . In 1820 the M[rsquo]tis people perfected industrialized slaughter.

The fish are now endangered along with Migratory birds, Wolverines and a culture is being diminished for the sake of foreign and domestic investors for Gold and the ever almighty dollar.

Nez Perce will see little of an economic boost but plenty of the detriment to the East Fork of the South Fork .

Some 3,000 Nez Perce people hunt, fish and gather for much of their sustenance.

Tributaries in the South Fork region provide for them.

It is unfair to those people

These lands are used for ceremony and sacred as any church.

The indigenous should be honored and respected just by leaving the land as is. (Alt.5)

Their grandchildren and ours deserve the right to experience all the waterways and wildlands that are left of this country . It has been exploited and extracted enough since First Contact. Industrialization and exploitation has been the legacy . Allow future generations the chance to be able to live and honor Indigenous Ways of Being and Mother Earth .

Some things are priceless and the SGPIs a good bet to come at a very high cost.
