However, I agree with the proposed project with thefollowing exception, that all motorized travel beyond FSR 514 /beyond of Doyle Creek Campground)be eliminated. All motorized travel (including the existing OHV designated trails) should be eliminated with the approval of this project. This includes the existing OHV designated trail systemwhich begins at FSR 514 and ends at Doyle Creek. The OHV trail system is commonly known as themainline of the Doyle motorized trail system or Doyle Creek Trail - #147 (including National ForestTrails 148, 147, 143 and 141) and currently traverses through sections 5, 8 and 9 of the Doyle AreaOHV trail area. We continue to observe noncompliance to the OHV designated trails with motorized vehicle tracks present on lands which are located outside of the designated trail areas. The existingtrail system utilizes a large portion of a relatively small geographic area of the Bighorn NationalForest. Much of the Bighorn National Forest is already accessible for use of OHV motorized travel. Itshould be noted that I do not have a problem with Forest Service personnel using the existingdesignated OHV trails to perform the proposed Aspen Restoration or WUI fuel Reduction Thinning,however upon completion of the project, the OHV trails should no longer be used by FS personnel. Wyoming is a unique place that as residents we largely enjoy for its wild and scenic beauty. Thegeographic area beyond Doyle Creek Campground is small and should be wilder and more scenic. Greater preservation is needed for this area as it provides a much-needed wildlife corridor for elkand is frequently used for calving. It is my hope that we can work together to ensure the BighornNational Forest will remain a special and unique place not only for ourselves but our children, grandchildren, and generations to come.
