Comments: Dear Ms Schuyler The Newark Project is in no way appropriate for a Categorical Exclusion. The Forest Service needs to do an Environmental Assessment Here are some reasons why:

- * this isn't a small project -- it is likely to involve up to 390 drill holes,
- * the company can't complete the project in one year,
- * there are certain to be cultural resources in the area that have to be protected,
- * Newark Project is upstream from Custer where they rely on clean water for tourism (French Creek, which the project would impact, runs right through Custer),
- * this is a "foot in the door" by the company. They actually want a larger project, so there would be cumulative impacts that are currently not described (their project was originally larger),
- * Newark Project requires construction of more than 1/3 mile of road and clearing of more than one acre of ground.
