A si gni f i cant port i on of t he educat i on mi ssi on of organi zat i ons l i ke ours and t he f undrai si ng t hat support s organi zat i ons l i ke ours comes f rom t hese organi zed event s, and we see t he cont i nuat i on of t hese event s as an i nt egral expressi on of prot ect ed ri ght s i ncl udi ng f reedom of speech and f reedom of assembl y. We bel i eve t hese event s are prot ect ed by t he F i rst A mendment and bel i eve t hey are cruci al t o cl ubs and organi zat i ons. T hese event s can onl y cont i nue i f t reat ment moves f orward. B RC recommends t reat ment on t he f ul l 125, 278 acres and al l l evel s of roads t ot al l i ng 2, 049 mi l es.

Wild fire

We recommend usi ng commerci al t reat ment i n t he maxi mum amount of I and possi bl e. B est avai I abl e sci ence shoul d be used i n maki ng t hese deci si ons. P ast f orest f i res t hat have burned rampant because of t he I ack of f orest proj ect s shoul d be I ooked at when maki ng deci si ons. T he removal of hazardous t rees wi I I benef i t t he overal I f ut ure of t he f orest . Ro ad s an d Trai I s

B RC commends the US F S in their efforts to have a sustainable and heal thy forest for all to use while improving access and roads in the system and to not address decommissioning roads or changing road designations in this planning process. We strongly encourage the US F S to fully analyze and consider adapting any temporary or unauthorized roads into the road system.

These roads will offer long term benefits to the forest. Roads act as a natural fire barrier and

provi de needed access t o i mpl ement proj ect s and f or emergency response t eams.

E co n o mi c Ben efi ts

Local communities rely on mot orized recreation for economic opport unities. There has been a surge of use throughout the nation on publiclands as well as inthis area. Local groups have worked hard to put the area on the map so that they could reap the economic benefits. Closing roads would greatly hinder economic opport unity. The proposed project provides local jobs and brings in local revenue. BRC supports these efforts and supports any comments made by locals and members who approve these projects for local economic benefit. Wildfire is the largest threat to habit at loss. One wildfire could cause an entire species to go extinct. We support the Forest Service in

properly managing the forest sto prevent wildfirest hat could cause harm to wildlife. Public Health and Safety

The removal of hazard trees is a matter of publichealth and safety. Not only can hazard trees prevent access for the general public but it can cause harm, prevent access for emergency response teams and act as fuels for will dfire. "It is well documented that exposure to wildfire smoke is associated

with adverse respiratory, cardiovascular, and birth outcomes, and premature mortality." Over the last three decades, the acreage burned annually by wildfire across the United States has doubled. This trend is driven by western states such as California, which experienced a fivefold increase in annual acreage burned from wildfire over the last half- century (Williams et al., 2019).

"In the United States, the overall population experiencing wildfire smoke will continue to increase due to projected increases in wildfires. Considering climate change projections through 2050, it is estimated that more than 82 million people in the United States will be subject to a 57% and 31% increase in the frequency and intensity of smoke waves, respectively (Liu et al., 2016a)."

Conclusion

We would like to close by saying we support "shared use". As I ong as overall visit at i on numbers are appropriate for the affect ed resources, mot orized and non-mot orized users can be compatible with one another solong as individual users understand designations and plantheir activities accordingly. Indeed, mot orized and nonmot orized recreation use of ten overlap as O HV 's of ten increase accessibility

t o non-mot ori zed recreat i onal act i vi t i es such as hi ki ng, campi ng, equest ri an use, et c. We al so hol d t hat
