Comments: Dear Director: The Carbon County Board of County Commissioners (BOCC) is aware that the United StatesDepartment of Agriculture (Department), Forest Service is preparing a draft Environmental ImpactStatement (EIS) and accepting scoping comments for the Land Management Plan Direction for Old GrowthForest Conditions Across the National Forest System. The Department has identified the ForestService as the Lead Agency for this amendment, and invited State agencies and Federally recognized Tribes and Alaska Native Corporations to indicate an interest if they would like to participate asCooperating Agencies. However, the Department has not extended the invitation to counties or conservation districts.Carbon County is concerned that it has not been invited to participate as a Cooperating Agencyduring the EIS process. As identified by 40 CFR [sect]1501.8, "(a) the purpose of this section is toemphasize agency cooperation early in the NEPA process. Upon request of the lead agency, any Federalagency with jurisdiction by law shall be a cooperating agency. In addition, upon request of the leadagency, any other Federal agency with special expertise with respect to any environmental issue may be accorperating agency. A State, Tribal, or local agency of similar qualifications may become accoperating agency by agreement with the lead agency. . . . ". A large portion of the Medicine BowNational Forest is located within Carbon County, and the resulting EIS may have a significant impact onCarbon County. Carbon County and our local conservation districts have extensive knowledge of theportions of the National Forest located in Carbon County and are likely to be helpful partners ininformation sharing and collaboration as the EIS is developed. Carbon County is responsible for thehealth, safety and welfare of its residents, and is regularly tasked with determining whether zoning and development requests have a deleterious effect upon the local environment. It has been incumbent uponCarbon County to balance the need for industrial growth and progress against the importance of conservation.
