The NPS administers the Lewis and Clark National Historic Trail (Trail) pursuant to the NPSOrganic Act of 1916 (54 USC [sect] 100101). The Trail was established by Congress in 1978 and isdefined as a trail following the outbound and return routes of the 1803-1806 Lewis and ClarkExpedition. Congress identified the historic route as a corridor based on the activities andobservations of the Expedition as documented in the journals and maps through the NationalTrails System Act (NTSA) as amended in 2019. Approximately 30 miles of the Trail and 19miles of the Lewis and Clark Auto Tour Route intersect the project area of the LMPR EIS.NPS staff may be able to share relevant data with USFS, participate in alternatives development, and identify significant issues for analysis and impact mitigations as the EIS progresses.
