In reading your document it was hard to believe the lack of interest you show in the natural resources of eastern Oregon. The natural resources of Grant County are the life blood for everyone who lives here, the sawmills, timber contractors, local citizens, miners, businessmen, schools, churches, road departments, ranchers, farmers, in some form they are all dependent on the timber resources from our land.
