Tuolumne County strongly supports the Social and Ecological Resilience Across the Landscape (SERAL) project that has been developed in cooperation with Yosemite Stanislaus Solutions (YSS). We commend the leadership of our partners which have demonstrated a continued commitment to completing vegetation treatments that benefit the environment, the economy, and the community.

This project is located in an area of Tuolumne County that is known to have some of our most fire prone landscape yet has experienced very little fire history. The County supports the SERAL project's use of prescribed fire, hand thinning, mastication, mechanical thinning, non-native invasive weed control and limited salvage operations to achieve the project's objectives. The strategic fuel reduction projects will shift forest structure and composition towards a range of natural conditions where ecological processes and adaptive capacity can evolve together

The Stanislaus National Forest is a critical resource to the economy and natural ecosystem of Tuolumne County.
