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Comments: As an Idaho state Representative and a member of the state House Health & Welfare Committee, I have dedicated my career as a public servant to ensuring the wellbeing of all Idahoans. Upon reviewing the draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for Midas Gold Idaho's Stibnite Gold Project, I write today to voice my support for the proposal. I am confident that the project will increase the wellbeing of our environmental and economy securing a healthier future for Idaho.

After nearly 100 years of mining in the Stibnite region, most during eras of lax or non-existent regulatory oversight, the environment is in need of repair. Abandoned pits have led to unhealthy levels of metals in surface and ground waters and vital fish populations are unable to properly migrate upstream to the Salmon River.
