Research and planning around wind prone harvest/management areas is needed prior to projectimplementation to at least minimize volume and inconvenience of blowdown. Throughout the BHNF, we see evidence of forest management that has not sufficiently considered theaspect and exposure of timber to prevent significalnt blow-down and fuels buildup after projectcompletion. If available, apply formulas for timber blow-down loss and acfess expertise to minimizethis problem. Thinning can betricky, especially with frequency of wind events. Removal of neighbor trees, depending on how muchand location, can open up stands beyond the targeted objective due to wind. Johnson CreekVegetative Management on the Tongue Ranger District can stand as an example of excessive blowdownloss and fuels buildup. Provide sufficient budget or include contract requirements that provide for blow-down removal ontrails and roads that can be implemented even years after project completion. Vegetative management plans should include the establishment and improvement of ski trails in thePole Creek area.All merchantable timber, especially lumber, should be used, sold1to contractors and sawmills. Avoidwaste. Nonmarketable trees should be made available for firewood gathering by public and properlyhandled bycontractor to avoid piling with dirt. Firewood piles should be placed in areas convenient topublic, if possible. Efforts should be made to minimize slash burning piles. Efforts to enhance riparian areas and aspen generation is appreciated as a part of this proposal. Temporary haul roads and skid trails should be closed to public access upon project completion to avoid accustomed use by forest users. Thank you for this opportunity to comment
