Midas has shown it is committed to cleaning up and repairing the preexisting environmental damage at the proposed site location. This restoration plan, while fantastic for our local environment, will also set a strong precedent for future companies looking to profit from Idaho's natural resources, empowering our communities and our citizenry to demand investment plans of the same quality in the future.

Over the life of the project, it is estimated that more than \$200 million will be generated in state and local taxes. Midas Gold alone would pay nearly \$100 million in corporate income taxes. This is a great opportunity to allocate more funds into education and first responders without adding any additional tax burden to the residents of our state.

I thank the U.S. Forest Service for its thorough review in the draft EIS it recently released. However, after careful consideration, I wish to encourage the U.S. Forest Service to adopt alternative 2 proposed by Midas Gold Idaho in their Plan of Restoration and Operations.
