
I am encouraged by the work the U.S. Forest Service has done to properly evaluate and develop the draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Midas Gold Idaho's Stibnite Gold Project. I am a strong proponent of building strong business opportunities here and believe that this private investment in our community will be extremely beneficial in creating jobs, increasing local business revenue, and providing a stronger education system for Idahoans.

Midas Gold is making an investment of \$1 billion in the state of Idaho over the duration of the Stibnite Gold Project. This is a free market way to create more revenue for our state and also restore our precious legacies, such as the historic Stibnite Mining District.

This project is estimated to bring 500-600 new jobs to our state during operations.
