I appreciate all that Midas Gold is planning to do as it will not only provide an economic boon but also clean up the environment.

I believe that Midas Gold Idaho's proposal offers a unique chance to ensure the longevity and prosperity of our communities. The creation of 500 new jobs would reduce the flight of young people to cities and other states. Partnerships with local businesses would revitalize our aging towns and provide capital for investments and growth. Additional tax revenue would help fund our schools and allow our towns to better serve their residents. The list of direct and indirect benefits of the plan is extensive.

The debate around the return of mining to Stibnite has been incorrectly framed as contest between environmental and industrial interests.
