Dear Okanogan-Wenatchee National Forest and North Central Washington Forest Health Collaborative partners,

Our focus has been on looking at the ways that forests, fish, farms, family, and fun are all important, but most importantly how it is all connected in our watershed. We explored your story map and videos and learned:

- Firefighters are keeping an eye on fires to make sure they don't get too big

- We learned that they analyzed the watersheds using science
- We learned a restoration project is when you fix something that might be broken. Technically, it's like
 taking an old car that's broken and the wheels don't work and the steering wheel doesn't work... you
