AGENCY COMMENTS: General:

All Nevada water laws must receive full compliance.

All water used on a project must be permitted by the State Engineer's Office.

All waters of the State belong to the public and may be appropriated for beneficial use pursuant to the provisions of Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) Chapters 533 and 534 and not otherwise.

Water diversions from any surface source must comply with the permitting provisions of Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) Chapter 533.

Water diversions from any underground source must comply with the permitting provisions of NRS 533 and 534. Any transfer of water rights may be submitted to the State Engineers office as per NRS 533.384. The State Engineer is authorized and is responsible for maintaining water right files and accompanying documents as per NRS Chapters 111, 240, 375, 532, 533 and 534.

Water for Construction Projects

Any water developments constructed and utilized for a beneficial use whether surface or underground must be done so incompliance with the referenced chapters of the NRS.

Ensure that any water used on a project for any use shall be provided by an established utility or under permit or temporary change application or waiver issued by the State Engineer's Office with a manner of use acceptable for suggested projects water needs.
