

(261.55 (b))


This prohibition is in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261.

CLOSURE ORDER PACIFIC CREST NATIONAL SCENIC TRAIL


AGENCY: Bureau of Land Management, California
(CA-930-08-4333-02)

ACTION: Notice of closure of those portions the Pacific Crest National Scenic Trail, administered by the Bureau of Land Management, in California, to using or possessing a bicycle.

SUMMARY: Under the authority of 43 CFR 8364.1(a) "Closure and Restriction Orders" using or possessing a bicycle on the Pacific Crest National Scenic Trail (PCNST), in California, is prohibited. This order is consistent with the PCNST Advisory Board recommendations, agencies' endorsement and Forest Service Order No. 88-2 (Pacific Southwest Region, April 21, 1988). This action is taken since the trail was designated for foot and equestrian use.

SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION: Violation of this regulation, by a member of the public, is punishable by a fine not to exceed \$1000, and/or imprisonment not to exceed 12 months. Penalties are contained in CFR Title 43, Chapter II, Part 8360, Subpart 8360.0-7.
