Background
In May 2016, EPA entered into a Consent Decree with Northwest Environmental Advocates to reconsider EPA's 2010 approval of Idaho's human health criteria for arsenic. In September 2016, EPA disapproved Idaho's human health criteria of $10 \mu \mathrm{~g} / \mathrm{L}$ arsenic for both consumption of fish only and consumption of fish \& water. The

requires that EPA propose new human health criteria for arsenic by November 15, 2018, and that EPA either approve Idaho's submittal of revised human health criteria for arsenic or promulgate federal criteria by July 15, 2019.
