I'm writing to express my full support of Perpetua Resources and the Stibnite Gold Project.

Over the past several years Perpetua has shown its commitment to moving a project forward that will not only have a positive impact on Idaho's economy, but to its local environment and U.S. National Security.

The Stibnite Gold Project is located on an abandoned mine site that is in high need of repair. Perpetua aims to leave the Stibnite site better than they found it and ultimately bring net benefits to water, fish, and wildlife by cleaning up over 10 million tons of legacy tailings and waste.

In addition to being an asset to the local environment, the project is crucial to strengthening U.S. National Security and could prove vital to the administration's stated supply chain goals by becoming the sole domestic producer of Antimony, which is 1 of 35 minerals deemed critical by the USGS.
