Thank you for the opportunity to provide feedback on the Stibnite Gold Project as part of Perpetua Resources' Supplemental Draft Environmental Impact Statement. Public participation is a huge part of the permitting process and I appreciate the opportunity to share my thoughts as a perpetua employee, but especially because the Stibnite Gold Project will leave conditions at the site better than they are today. The NEPA process has been robust and the public input has led the company to a project that we can be proud of as Idahoans and Valley County residents.

There are many reasons to support Perpetua Resources improved mine plan. However, this lined in the SDEIS stood out to me: "The restoration activities, particularly providing volitional passage in the East Fork SFSR, would result in a major, permanent, regional, and beneficial effect on Chinook salmon, steelhead, bull trout, and west slope cutthroat trout within the vicinity of mine."
