Comments: I strongly believe that the proposed plan does not:

- limit firewood harvesting enough in the Western Sound. High use campsites and beaches that I have kayaked to are very impacted in many areas, in my opinion diminishing the intent of both the WSA and of EVOS acquired lands. EVOS acquired

- properly manage 4-wheeler use by black bear hunters. While not extensive in area, where they are used the impact to soil is deep and severe. Clearer regulations would benefit everyone before areas are damaged to the point of 'no-use'.

- nor does the plan control snowmachine use in the WSA. New sleds are able to access much more of this terrain than several years ago, and I've seen an impressive number of tracks out of Whittier past the head of Blackstone Bay. ANILCA acquired lands should not allow snowmachine recreation as 'traditional', especially within a WSA.
