I am writing this letter to express my concern for the ongoing protection of the relatively undisturbed roadless areas in the Colville National Forest. It is my hope that there be a balanced forest plan between ecosystem preservation and forest use. There should be consideration for ranching, timber, and recreational interests, but the major priorities for me are: 1) the preservation of a healthy forest ecosystem that provides diverse wildlife habitat 2) the preservation of important migration corridors, and 3) the preservation of important watersheds.

I appreciate having the opportunity to comment on the Colville National Forest Land and Management Plan Revision, and I want to state that I am in favor of Alternative B.

Setting aside the remaining roadless areas along the Kettle Crest and in the Salmo Priest with a wilderness sort of designation is critically important, so that those few undisturbed areas that are left are preserved for important ecosystem maintenance.
