You remove over 200 trees and then put down grass seed. How is this acceptable to the Forest Service? The protector of our public lands. I insist as an owner of the land, that the Forest Service, if they approve this project, require AMI to replace all trees removed, the planting to be done by a licensed arborist. I insist that a simple drip irrigation system be put in place to insure that the trees survive, the system would be removed after the trees are established. The plantings should be checked once every few months to ensure the trees survival. Any trees that do not survive must be replaced. The forest Service is in charge of protecting our public lands. Mining companies are given free access to our public lands, they must be required to restore the land as best as possible to its original state.
