When markets fall, the land suffers. In Pennsylvania we have many streams that run red and dead due to acid mine drainage from old abandoned coal mines. If this plan is allowed to go through, please determine a comprehensive reclamation plan cost and make sure that the bond posted by the company is sufficient to cover that cost. But, please consider not allowing this plan to proceed. The contaminants in question, mercury and arsenic, are known environmental bad actors.
