Comments: Atlantic Coast Pipeline Decision Objection

Dear Forest Service:

I live in Rockingham County, I am an intervenor for the ACP. I am writing to object to the Forest Service's Record of Decision concerning the proposed Atlantic Coast Pipeline (ACP), specifically in its plans for crossing of the George Washington and Monongahela National Forests. It cannot be built safely or without serious impacts to our water, forests and wildlife habitat.

I strongly urge the Forest Service to issue an amended Record of Decision which denies permission for the Atlantic Coast Pipeline to pass through the George Washington and Monongahela National Forests.

I live downstream from headwaters of drinking water sources in Augusta County, which contain extremely sensitive karst terrain. If this pipeline construction is allowed to begin, waterways will be buried. Drinking water for residents both within and outside the National Forest lands will likely be disturbed or ruined. This is not acceptable to be permitted by the USFS

It is crucial for the sake of our mountains, drinking water, and forest habitats that the USFS change its record of decision to deny permit for the Atlantic Coast Pipeline. This is a project with extreme and unaccounted-for risks, and the safety of our George Washington and Monongahela National Forests CANNOT be guaranteed. Atlantic Coast Pipeline LLC has not fulfilled its responsibilities as an applicant for the permit, and has not demonstrated that they can construct their pipeline safely while accounting for our protected lands. In fact, this company has NO experience building a 42" pipeline across steep mountainous areas.

Let's not be an experiment for Dominion! Just say no!
