The Ruby Mountains are one of the most spectacular landscapes in Nevada. With abundant big game, robust trout fisheries, and dense sage grouse habitat, the Ruby Mountains are a critical resource for wildlife.

Hydraulic fracturing and drilling for oil and gas would irreparably harm this undisturbed area. The waters that trout rely on could be poisoned in spills or well failures after fracking. Mule deer habitat would be fragmented and the deer's ability to safely overwinter would be compromised. Vulnerable sage grouse, known to be negatively affected by oil and gas development, will inch steadily closer to extinction.
