GAWRD Fisheries Interests Within the Foothills Project Boundary

1. Restore stream connectivity. Replace old structures, like damaged culverts, that inhibit fish passage.
 - a. Ex: Mill Creek OHV Trail entrance (Murray Co).
2. Maintain existing trout stream habitat enhancement structures.
 - a. Ex: Jones, Sarahs, Mountaintown, Rock creeks.
3. Enhance stream habitat with techniques such as whole tree felling ("Chop and Drop")
 - a. Ex: Several dozen small wild trout streams across the entire project.
4. Minimize erosion and stream sedimentation, especially by maintaining forest roads.
 - a. Ex: Holly and Mill creeks, dozens of others with adjacent or crossing forest roads.
5. Enhance access for fish stocking and angling.
 - a. Ex: Stonewall, Panther, Nimblewill, Mountaintown, Holly creeks.
6. Acquire new lands, especially key inholdings.
 - a. Sensitive issue, so tracts are unnamed here.
7. Collaborate with adjacent landowners to restore water quality and instream habitat.
 - a. Ex: Warwoman, Stonewall, Bull, Holly creeks, and several small lakes.
8. Enhance boating access.
 - a. Ex: lakes Rabun, Conasauga, Murrays, and Peeples.
9. Enhance fish habitat in impounded waters.
 - a. Ex: lakes Conasauga, Murrays, Peeples.
10. Restore aquatic habitat, especially for sensitive species.
 - a. Ex: Upper Etowah watershed.

11. Install deepwater releases on trout stream impoundments.
 - a. Ex: ten small lakes on USFS or private property (see #7)
12. Maintain small lake fertilization programs to enhance Warmwater fisheries.
 - a. Ex: lakes Conasauga, Murrays, and Tails Creek.
