Comments: 1) There is a need and opportunity for additional Wilderness and Wild & Scenic Rivers on the GMUG.

2) The Draft Assessment for Recreation states that the public wants more motorized trails, but this is unsubstantiated. I live in the upper Gunnison valley year-around and my friends and I have had many negative experiences with the latest wave of ORV ("razors"). Primarily the increased numbers and specifically speeding on all unpaved roads leading out of Crested Butte.

Have you been to Tincup, Pitkin or Lake City in the summer for the last two decades? ... do we really need to have more space for off-road vehicles. Unfortunately, off-road vehicles and any other use (biking, hiking, horse) of roads are not compatible.

3) Dispersed campsites need better management, especially those around Crested Butte.

I volunteer with groups at Crested Butte in October to clean up dispersed camp sites along Gothic road and Slate river. The amount of human waste from the last two summers is atrocious. I applaud the new bathrooms and camp host at Oh-be-joyful but that is not enough.

I have volunteered at CBMR in the summer to help people negotiate the hike to the top of Mt. CB. For the first time this year CBMR had to adopt rope lines and numerous signs indicating that you have to stay on the trail! ... this really was not necessary 5 years ago. This type of signage had to be implemented at RMBL last summer as well. The lack of understanding of wilderness etiquette and the overwhelming numbers of visitors must be better managed.
