While some lands are already designated as "Wilderness," many others have been recommended, and the Forest Service should consider recommending more. Without more protected areas, the current Wilderness areas will be isolated islands. I don't want to have to tell my children, "That used to be beautiful forest land, filled with trees and birds, but now it is filled with oil and gas wells."
