People from across the state use the Wayne National Forest for hiking, fishing, camping, bird-watching and other forms of recreation. So it's critical that the Forest Service involve these people by publicizing and hosting meetings in places like Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, Toledo, Akron and Dayton. Our temperate forests serve as critical infrastructure against the continuing effects of climate change. More than ever, these forests represent so much more to our way of live than is ever captured on a 'benefits' list. We need water protection not fracking which is limited and one-way. Water is Ohio's lifeblood.

It's also important that the Forest Service be proactive and searching in its efforts to identify information about the potential harms that fracking, mining and logging could bring to the Wayne's forests, streams, watersheds and biodiversity.
