That is why, after all these years and places that I operated in, in Alaska, I now operate along Martin River. I can operate anywhere in the vast State of Alaska, but there is nowhere else, even in the Great Land, like the Martin River.

Allowing development that could and probably would damage one of THE most important ecosystems, and wetlands, migratory bird habitats, and one of the Richest salmon runs in North America would be unbelievably shortsighted and catastrophic. This is no area to be risking damaging.

Besides ruining my small business, and the businesses of several other guides on the Martin, look at the potential damage to one of the most important commercial, sport, and subsistence fisheries in Alaska, that would be posed by a road up the Martin River Valley!!! Please mine your coal somewhere not SO ecologically significant. thank you so much!!

I would also wish to express my objection for the US forest service or state of Alaska to allow access to public lands to facilitate drilling of, or transportation of, crude oil drilled on private land in the Katalla / Bering area.
