We love the mountains so much that we purchased a cabin is Sky High Ranch on Hwy 4 near Tamarack. Sky High Ranch is a snowmobile community as most of the roads are not plowed in the winter. We currently have snowmobile access to the area adjacent to our subdivision and would like this access to continue in the future for obvious reasons. This area allows us access to Bear Valley and the groomed roads that allow us to explore the high county along hwy 4. Due to continuing efforts modern snowmobiles get great gas mileage and are quieter than ever before. They also exert less pounds per square inch that any other form of off road transportation. The national Forest belongs to all of us and responsible use by all parties should be encouraged. I personally have never seen any cross county skiers in our area and find it quite selfish that one groups long term goal is to close the entire Sierras to all forms of motorized recreation.
