I currently live in Yakutat, and have been living in Alaska for 25 years. I have been riding snowmachines in the Chugach for 7 years, and fly out from Yakutat to enjoy the beautiful scenery offered as often as possible (usually 6-10 times per year). As a motorized user, I oppose losing any right to motorized access of these public lands. A large majority of the Chugach is already restricted to non-motorized use, and what's left shall remain intact, if not expanded, for future generations. Taking away certain areas would mean a complete lifestyle change for myself and many others who consider the Chugach our sacred playground.

The areas I access the forest are: Johnson Pass, Turnagain, Lost Lake, Summit Lake

The rights of motorized user groups have diminished since 2002 when The National Forest Service initiated the Forest Land Management Plan and it must stop.

Please consider leaving the current access in place and work toward opening more areas for future generations.
