I currently live in Wasilla, and have been living in Alaska for 29 years. I have enjoyed riding snowmachines and snowboarding in the Chugach for 20 years, and I typically go 14 times a year by sled and maybe half that on a board. As a avid snowmachiner, I oppose losing any right to motorized access of these public lands. A large majority of the Chugach is already restricted to non-motorized use, and what's left shall remain intact, if not expanded, for future generations.

The areas I access the forest are, Johnson Pass, Turnagain, Skookum, Lost Lake, Summit Lake, Resurrection Pass as well as many others around the state.

The rights of motorized user groups have diminished since 2002 when The National Forest Service initiated the Forest Land Management Plan and it must stop. I strongly feel that both groups should strive to work together and share all of the available area.

Please consider leaving the current access in place and work toward opening more areas for future generations.
